Thomas was also fond of music with Lyric FM on in the background while he went about life at home. A wonderful friend and colleague who will be sorely missed by us all.

On behalf of all of us, Shrine and Parish, I offer our deepest condolences to Thomas' family and wish them to know that all our prayers are with them now and into the difficult time ahead as they are with all who suffer as a result of such tragic loss. The good Lord is kind and merciful, we trust in His love for us and in His outstretched arms to welcome us onto the shores of Eternity.
